#### THE WEATHER IN SANTA ANA PUEBLO THIS TIME OF YEAR

• Expect typical summer weather in Santa Ana Pueblo, NM. Daytime temperatures will generally be in the 90's Fahrenheit (30's Celsius), and may reach upwards of 100 degrees Fahrenheit (38+ Celsius) on July 12 and 13. Nighttime temperatures will drop to the mid-60s (16-18 Celsius), which means you may need a rebozo or light sweater. The forecast currently calls for mostly sunny skies with occasional clouds in the evenings. There is a slight chance of thunderstorms or light rain on July 14 due to the North American Monsoon, which can bring brief periods of increased humidity and precipitation to an otherwise very dry climate. Winds will generally be light, ranging from 5 to 10 mph, shifting from southwest to southeast as the week progresses. For more information go to National Weather Service or Weather.gov.



- Evenings, and air conditioned meeting rooms can feel quite chilly. For your comfort, please be sure to pack a sweater and/or light jacket.
